The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) will begin accepting new enrollments for the Veteran Employment Through Technology Education Courses (VET TEC) Pilot Program for terms beginning on or after September 4, 2023.

The VET TEC pilot originally exhausted fiscal year (FY) 2023 program funding in April 2023. Reallocated funding for the program allows VA to start accepting new FY 2023 enrollments for eligible participants. It was necessary for VA to initially set aside full funding for each VET TEC participant; however, as VET TEC participants have exited the program VA is able to determine the actual funding used. Additionally, on October 1, 2023, \$45,000,000 will be allocated to the program for FY 2024.

VET TEC is a 5-year pilot program, ending on April 1, 2024, for eligible GI Bill beneficiaries connecting them, at no charge against their benefit entitlement, to accelerated learning programs in high tech fields. If you are a Veteran or Service

member who is within 180 days of separating from active duty and are interested in participating in the VET TEC program, visit the program webpage to learn more. Including, but not limited to, eligibility requirements.

Please note that participation in VET TEC is contingent on the availability of funding. Additionally, you must continue to meet all VET TEC eligibility requirements.
