Study: Understanding Why Some Veterans Have Not Yet Used Post-9/11 GI Bill Benefits



The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides educational benefits to help veterans pursue postsecondary education and job training. However, some veterans who are eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill are not using their benefits. The American Institutes for Research (AIR), together with Veterans Education Success, seek to better understand why some veterans may not have used their benefits. Through this research, we seek to improve veterans' outcomes and experiences.

STUDY RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- What concerns and challenges do veterans identify in using their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits?
- What needs, policies, and practices might support veterans to use their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits and pursue postsecondary education and training?

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

In this study, veterans will be asked to participate in a 60-minute interview or focus group to share their experiences in the military, post-military employment and transition to civilian life and experiences and thoughts about the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

Participant Eligibility Requirements

We seek **U.S. military veterans up to age 65** who:

- Last served as an enlisted service member.
- Served at least 3 years on active duty or are otherwise eligible for 100% of Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits.
- Have not yet used (or transferred) their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits.

Interviews and focus groups will be virtual and scheduled at a time that is convenient for the

participant. All participants will receive a **\$50 Amazon gift card** as an acknowledgment and thank you for their time.
